Yet it will continue to be an endless task until we go upstream and find out why people are falling in."

WHAT **BRINGS JUSTICE?**



Since 1988, the Hillsborough Organization for Progress and Equality has been a vehicle to unite diverse congregations to improve the quality of life in Hillsborough County by achieving greater justice and fairness through systemic change.

Fifty-two times a year, we gather for Sunday worship. Once a year, we gather for justice. At Nehemiah Action, we invite officials who can correct a systemic injustice in our society to face thousands of citizens from the HOPE congregation. Then, we ask the officials to take specific action to correct the injustice. The more people in attendance, the better our chances are of the officials agreeing to help make a meaningful change.

NEW AFFORDABLE HOUSING



To date, \$46 million has been disbursed by the HOPE Affordable Housing Act to create 1,100 housing units.

LISTENING AND SHARING

Micah tells us God requires three (3) things: "To do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God." While we can always do better in walking humbly and showing mercy, "doing justice" is our biggest challenge. Doing justice starts right here - listening to each other's concerns and struggles and joining with other people of faith across the county to address serious community problems. This is an opportunity to have a sacred conversation with each other and act on God's call to do iustice.

Sometimes we don't connect our personal experiences to community problems. Other times, we blame ourselves or feel ashamed to share. Yet, in justice ministry we've learned when we share our stories, we discover other people have similar experiences. Sharing our stories unites us and then enables us to win solutions that improve the lives of thousands of families.
